A message from the Property Committee

New Security Cameras - The Official Board authorized the purchase of a new security camera system at its last meeting. The system replaces the existing system which is obsolete and has been nonfunctioning for the past two years. The new system will have 12 cameras, including 3 outside cameras located on the south side, the east (front) side and the north side of the building. The cameras will record 24/7 and will be

monitored. The cost of this new system is not to exceed \$15,000. A generous donor has agreed to pay one third of the cost, one third will come from our Trust Funds and the remaining third will need to be raised by the congregation. This Week's Minute for Mission

Northern United Church ministers are facing a crisis.
